



Kunene Camino Travel Itinerary

9-Day Walking Breakdown

Your Kunene Camino adventure covers 9 days of hiking, with daily distances varying slightly based on the measuring device. Here's a guide to what you can expect:

- Day 1: 14 km
- Day 2: 19 km
- Day 3: 15 km
- Day 4: 15 km
- Day 5: 19 km
- Day 6: 17 km
- Day 7: 15 km
- Day 8: 16 km
- Day 9: 16 km

Each day begins just before sunrise, allowing us to take advantage of the cooler morning hours. We'll enjoy breakfast en route and aim to reach camp by lunchtime. The afternoons are yours to relax, recharge, and enjoy the serene river surroundings before gathering for sundowners and dinner at sunset.



Day 1

Windhoek to Ruacana

Your adventure kicks off with an early morning departure from Windhoek. We'll pick you up from your accommodation and head north on a scenic drive through Namibia's breathtaking landscapes. Along the way, we'll stop in the quaint town of Outjo for lunch (own account) and to give you the chance to stock up on supplies for our charity initiative.

Charity Drive with a Purpose

The Kunene Camino is about more than exploration—it's also an opportunity to give back. As part of our journey, you'll have the privilege of distributing staple foods to Himba communities along the route, creating meaningful connections and supporting local families.

Our first overnight stop is at Tjonkubi Otjiruwo. Upon arrival, you'll have time to familiarize yourself with the camp setup and meet your fellow adventurers. As the sun sets, we'll gather for a warm welcome and a delicious dinner prepared by our support team. Enjoy your first evening under Namibia's vast, starlit skies before settling in for a peaceful night's rest.



Days 2 to 10

Hiking along the Kunene River

For the next nine days, we'll follow the course of the majestic Kunene River, covering distances of 14 to 19 km per day. Each morning, we set off just before sunrise, embracing the cool early hours. We'll enjoy a well-deserved breakfast along the trail, making the most of the peaceful mornings.

By lunchtime, we'll arrive at our (mobile) campsite, where you can relax, refresh, and unwind.

The afternoons are yours to enjoy—whether that's taking a dip in swimming pool and/or the river (where safe), lounging under a palm tree in the shade, or simply soaking in the tranquility of this remote wilderness. As the day draws to a close, we'll gather for sunset drinks before a hearty dinner is served just after sunset.

Campsites Along the Way: Throughout the journey, we mix wild camping in secluded spots with stays at some of the region's best riverside lodges and campsites:

- Tjonkubi Otjiruwo
- Mavinga Lodge
- Kunene River Lodge
- Camp Cornie (2 nights)
- Epupa Falls Lodge and Campsite
- Variation of wild camping spots

These carefully chosen locations offer a mix of comfort, stunning views, and opportunities to connect with the surrounding landscape.



Day 11

Epupa Falls to Kamanjab

With our walking adventure complete, we begin the journey back to Windhoek. We'll depart from Epupa Falls and travel via Opuwo to the town of Kamanjab, where we'll spend the night. This final evening on the road is a chance to unwind and reflect on the incredible journey you've just completed. At the same time tonight is a good chance to spot some porcupines.



Day 12

Return to Windhoek

After breakfast, we continue our drive south through Namibia's scenic landscapes, aiming to reach Windhoek by late afternoon. We'll drop you off at your accommodation, bringing this unforgettable journey to a close.

Highlights of the Journey

- Walking along the Kunene River, starting below Ruacana Falls and ending at Epupa Falls.
- A mix of formal campsites and wild camping for an immersive wilderness experience.
- Sundowner moments by the river and stargazing under clear Namibian skies.
- Encounters with traditional OvaHimba and OvaVimba communities along the way.
- Time to relax, disconnect, and recharge in one of Namibia's most remote regions.
